
Plan for a diversity of students and situations!

Stay one step ahead! Create flexibility.


## **What situations?**

# 140 suggestions for UDeL Context Cards

- From 4 international Camps
- 35 teachers, pedagogic developers, librarians, etc.
- Based on their own experiences of “unexpected” situations
- → 25 cards?

## Use:

- Situations – not solutions
- A tool for teachers to test their courses in advance
- Discussion material about new cards and solutions

# Learning material for teachers: Context Cards

Example of situations a proactive teacher can prepare for:

## Theft

"A student had his laptop stolen and need to attend your online course using his smartphone."



## Children

"A student needs to pick up his child at the day-care centre and can not attend any lectures late afternoons."



# Context Cards (slide 2 of 3)

Example of situations a proactive teacher can prepare for:

## **Oral exam**

“A student wants to have an oral exam instead of a written exam.”



## **Harassments**

“One student makes an offensive comment about another student.”



# Context Cards (slide 3 of 3)

Example of situations a proactive teacher can prepare for:

## Death

"A relative of a student has recently died."



## No camera

"The whole family is trying to work and study from home. A student does not want to have the camera on."
